CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 1940 SEASON

FOREST LAKE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

The first fiscal year of the Association has been completed and we who have worked as organizers and directors feel that it has been a significantly successful one.

To those of you who were not in the Association since its inception we would like to give you a brief summary of its beginnings:

- A. The organization committee started from scratch with no funds to build an organization of the type desired by the majority of the property-owners, a non-profit corporation. None of the committee had any previous experience in organizing a non-profit improvement association and there was not any precedent of a similar association to guide us. Therefore, mistakes, some of which cost money, were made in the matter of incorporating, deciding on By-Laws, and evolving a membership plan, none of which should ever occur again as we now have a smoothly running organization. There should be no reoccurence of the lack of cooperation evident during the last year due to the basic simplicity of the organization set-up and the support of its people. There are now 210 members.
- B. Very little work was done for the community during the first part of the term other than the difficult job of setting up the organization which threw all of the attending expenses on the end of the period. Much work was done then but more work will be done now that we have funds to work with. To illustrate this,—the first picnic left us with a net of \$385.25 and with this as a nucleus the following expenses were drawn:

Sundry organization expenses - \$75.26
Stationery, supplies, postage notices, and sundry items - 223.16
\$298.42

The receipts from the Halloween party added \$197.08 to the nucleus and this summer the following community expenditures were made.

Then came the Fall Carnival which, in spite of the inclement weather, showed a profit of \$302.65 which leaves our bank balance approximately where we began after the first picnic and with the organization completed and the above mentioned work done. So, considering all angles, we feel that our infant year has been a successful one and with a total of 210 memberships as a beginning we expect the Association to grow and become a large asset in our lives at Forest Lake.

From those directors who are retiring come the best wishes for every success of the new board; and to all those who have served I wish to convey, not only my personal thanks, but those on the behalf of the entire Association for a hard job well done.
