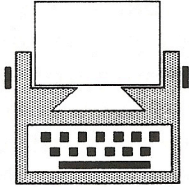

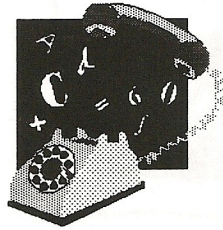
We're soooo sorry...

Ladies Night Out

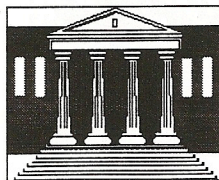

The Library is located at 135 S. Buesching Road, Lake Zurich. It's a large building full of books.

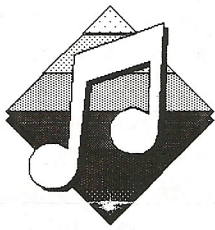


It's In The Mail - Part Deux

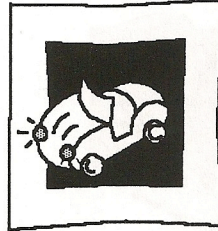


Sssshhhhhh.....

If you are the victim of one of these individuals, you could first warn them, and then call the Lake County Sheriffs Office and file a complaint - it is against the

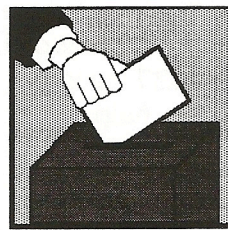
law to disturb the peace.

Though they may not have seen a great deal of activity this summer, the parking lots at the beaches should not be used as supplemental parking for nearby residents.

In the future, any cars in the lot after park closing time will be ticketed and towed. Any car parked on Association property which does not bear a Forest Lake sticker will be ticketed and towed - regardless of time of day.



Government Corner

There weren't enough board members for a quorum at the last meeting so no business was conducted. However, our County Board Member, Pam Newton, was there and she had good news for Forest Lake.

She was successful in getting

\$250,000 for storm water sewers. Construction which should begin next year. This is very good news for people with basement swimming pools. Bob Greever was instrumental to Pam's getting this funding as Ela Township is contributing \$80,000 in matching funds.

It is now official - Forest Lake has a creek. The creek will be delineated and declared a flood zone. This means construction takes on new twists as builders can't simply re-route or build over the waterway.

The Lake County Framework Plan should be ready and available for viewing this month. This is a nearly 2 inch thick document detailing planned development and conservation for our county's future.

Slow Down... you'll live longer

Those drivers who are aware of such things may have noticed our speed limits have been lowered. This plan was in the works for some time and the signs are being gradually replaced. The new limit is 25 mph (down from 30).

Remember: there are no sidewalks, people walk in the street and children are everywhere so please drive carefully.
