We are happy to say that the intersection of Overhill and Highland is now a four-way stop and that most folks



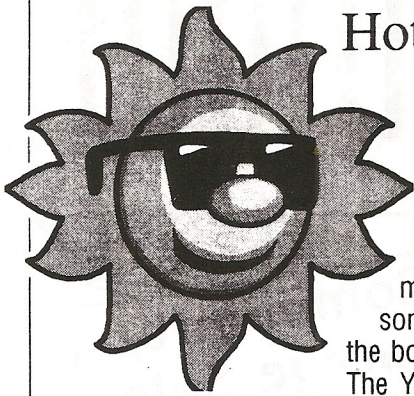
actually treat it as such. More information on other intersections will be forthcoming.

Thanks again for your effort Mandy—it's nice to see someone contributing to the community that way!

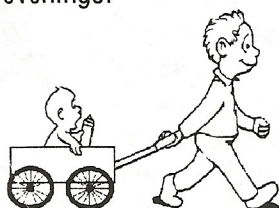
Goin' to the Dogs: Greyhound Yard Sale

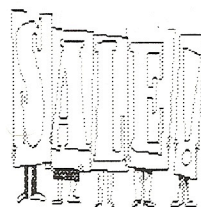
