# Membership Cards, Boat & Windshield Stickers

If you rent your home, please contact your landlord to obtain cards. As a reminder, all boats on the lake or stored on our beaches must have a boat sticker or they will be removed. This will be enforced all year so keep your stickers current.

Planting the Rain Garden at the Community Center

# Rain Garden

The Rain Garden at the Community Center is complete. Some of you may have seen the front-page photos in the Lake Zurich Courier last month. If you'd like to view the garden, it is located behind the Community Center. The rain garden is designed to capture run-off from the building and parking lot and allow it to soak into the ground rather than run off into the stream. Wild flowers and grasses have been planted to help the water absorption and to beautify the area. # What Goes In, Stays In

Development decreases the recharging groundwater by increasing the impermeable surface area with buildings, roads and driveways. Instead of rainfall infiltrating into the aquifer, it runs off to lakes and streams. The storm water from roofs, driveways, parking lots and streets contains contaminants such as gasoline, oils, metals, road salt and bacteria which will end up either in our ground water, lake or streams. Fertilizers applied to lawns and other plants may also leach into our groundwater while the phosphorus may run off into our lake and streams. Any gasoline, oil, or chemical spills may, over many years, seep into our drinking water aguifer. It is important that we clean up spills and not pour leftover weed killer, fertilizers and chemicals in the corner of our backyards. SWALCO has hazardous waste pickup at designated locations throughout the year. For further information check out www.swalco.org. SWALCO also accepts the new compact fluorescent light bulbs. As a reminder, these cannot be disposed of with your regular garbage, as they contain small amounts of mercury. SWALCO will also take leftover paint and electronics on designated days.

# Garbage Contract

Ela Twp. is finalizing their proposed contract to put out a single contract for all unincorporated areas. The contract that we now have with Waste Management is better than the proposed contract. We are attempting to have the township not include Forest Lake in the contract.

#### Roads

The blacktop will be ground off and replaced on about 25% of the roads in Forest Lake this summer. Because of the increase in oil prices, Ela twp. cannot replace all the roads at the same time. All roads will be replaced over the next 4 years.
