Boat Launch Upgrade

We are looking at upgrading the boat launch to make it easier for members to launch their boats. Methods and installation options are being researched.

Aquatic Hitchhikers

Aquatic hitchhikers have been a growing problem in many bodies of water, including Asian Carp and Zebra Mussels in Lake Michigan. If you launch your boat in another lake or river, please scrub it clean before

launching it in our lake, in order to eliminate the risk of unwanted species ending up in our lake. Similarly, do not set aquatic plants in the lake (i.e., grasses, water lilies), as some varieties can be highly invasive and overtake a lake. FLCA has recently planted recommended aquatic vegetation to improve the quality of the lake—these were purchased from a supplier who specializes in aquatic plants and will be beneficial to our lake.

Be Careful When Fertilizing

Toledo's drinking water was recently contaminated by an algae bloom caused by phosphates in Lake Erie. Phosphates will not cause contamination of our drinking water but have caused algae blooms and excessive weed growth in our lake. As phosphates flow out of our lawns and lake, they cause rapid algae growth in other streams, rivers and lakes. Please use fertilizers that do not contain phosphates, which are available wherever you purchase your usual fertilizer

Slow Down!

If you see cars speeding down our streets, do not hesitate to call the Lake County Sheriff: 847-377-4000 with the license number, if available. Note the time so that if there are patterns, the Sheriff can monitor.

Fall Leaves

Leaves, acorns and other yard waste can significantly contribute to the nitrogen and phosphorous levels in Forest Lake. Composting your leaves is a great way to dispose of them by turning them into a high quality fertilizer for your garden. Thoroughly mulching your leaves with a mulching lawnmower is the second-best option. Although some of the mulched pieces will find their way into the lake, they will also act as a natural fertilizer for your lawn. Learn more at www.goodcompost.com.

If you do not compost, bagging your leaves and disposing them through curbside pickup is an option. Waste Management: (1-800-796-9696) offers yard waste pickup for \$2/mo from April through November. Many blowers have a mulching function, which can decrease the overall volume to less than half.

Burning leaves has a negative impact on our environment and some of our neighbors have

respiratory problems. If you burn, please be considerate of your neighbors and consider which way the wind is blowing. Burning leaves on the street is illegal in Lake County, as it damages the street, and may result in a fine.
